# Overview of SDGs

---

UNO's Sustainable Development Goals have been adopted by 193 countries including India.

---

17 SDGs are further divided into 169 targets and 243 Global Indicators

---

Government of India has developed a National Indicators Framework comprised 306 indicators

---

NITI Aayog has identified 62 priority indicators. However ADs need not limit to priority indicators if they can benefit from other indicators.

---

GOI has further mandated states to prepare State Indicators Framework

# RFD vs. SDGs

---

Results Framework Document was a similar process but the Goal setting exercise was too loosely defined.

---

Sustainable Development Goals are internationally accepted goals and provide a definitive framework to pursue.

---

The framework provides defined, quantified and measurable set of Goals, Targets and indicators and hence is amenable to monitoring and evaluation.

---

The progress will be measured using credible data sources.

---

Indices can be developed to compare progress of each districts.

# Action already Taken

---

Punjab Vision Document, 2030 has been prepared and circulated to the Administrative Secretaries. Available at [www.pbplanning.gov.in](http://www.pbplanning.gov.in)

---

A Task Force has been constituted under the Chairmanship of Finance and Planning Minister, Punjab to review and monitor Sustainable Development Goals.

---

Steering Committee under Chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Punjab has also been constituted for steering and monitoring the implementation of SDGs.

---

National Indicators Framework has been adopted and circulated to ADs.

# Action already Taken ...

---

Each of the Sustainable Development Goals and the Targets have been mapped with implementing departments.

---

One department has been made a Nodal Department for each SDG

---

Central/State schemes have been mapped with indicators.

---

NITI Aayog has prepared SDG India Index on the basis of 62 priority indicators.

# Four Year Strategic Action Plan

- Guidelines for preparation of Four Year Strategic Action Plan (2019-23) and Annual Action Plan- 2019-20 have been issued vide Planning Department letter dated 17th December, 2018.
- To facilitate the drawing up of the Four-year Strategic Action Plan, 2019-23, a Template, alongwith 3 Annexures, has been developed and circulated.

## 1. Vision/Mission Statements of the Department.

- To define here department's vision and mission duly aligned to the relevant Sustainable Development Goals with a four-year perspective, keeping in view the 2030 perspective as well.
- However the action plan of department should go beyond the Sustainable development Goals encompassing the development activities envisaged by the department.

## 2. Sectoral Sustainable Development Goals and Targets.

- To give details of sectoral Sustainable Development Goals, decomposed into Targets, to be achieved under this 4-year Strategic Action Plan- briefly explaining how the achievement of Targets shall help in realization of the relevant Sustainable Development Goals.
- To be supplemented by Annexure 1, and Annexure 2.

## 3. Present Status of the Goals, Targets and Baseline values of the Indicators.

- To give here details of the current status of the Goals, Targets and the indicators, particularly with reference to state's position in comparison with other states.
- Specific areas/districts/blocks which are ahead or which lag and therefore, require special attention shall be highlighted here.

## 4. Strategy to realize the Sustainable Development Goals.

- To give details of strategies to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals, indicating how the department intends to allocate available financial, HR and other resources to maximize outcomes to realize these Goals.
- Any policy issues and alternative policies required to be put in place shall also be discussed here.

# Four Year Strategic Action Plan ...

## 5. Details of the planned Interventions, Schemes and Projects with Indicators.

- To give details of the specific interventions, schemes and projects that the department intends to implement.
- This would include activities relating to the whole spectrum of allocations and spending by the departments.
- The interventions, schemes and projects will further lead to indicators, which may be either outcome indicators or process indicators.
- Departments may determine their own indicators relevant to their Goals which alongwith the National Indicators Framework will constitute the State Indicators Framework.
- This section may be supplemented with information in Annexure – 1 and Annexure - 2.

# Four Year Strategic Action Plan ...

## 6. Key Performance Parameters for Key Personnel

- To give here the identified measurable Key Performance Parameters for Key Personnel.
- The PARs of the Key Personnel shall review the achievement of the Key Performance Parameters.
- Annexure 3 to be used for this.

## 7. Monitoring of Progress.

- To give here the system of monitoring the achievement of the targets set for the indicators.
- The department shall also indicate its data and information policy with a view to ensure that reliable data, aggregated from the base data where-ever possible, duly validated and audited by 3rd parties where required, are available to measure the progress of the targeted indicators.
- The Annual Administration Report of the department shall contain an executive summary of the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals.



# SDG India Index

- The SDG India Index tracks progress of all States and UTs on 62 Priority Indicators selected by NITI Aayog.
- The SDG India Index spans 13 out of 17 SDGs based on 62 priority indicators.
- A composite score was computed between the range of 0-100 for each State/UT, indicating average performance of State/UT towards achieving 13 SDGs & their respective targets.
- If a State/UT achieves a score of 100, it signifies that it achieved the 2030 national targets. The higher the score of a State/UT, the greater the target achieved
